
Workshop 3

CEDAW - Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination and All Forms of Violence against Women


Convention on the Rights of the Child Article 19



How does violence in close relationships differ between the genders?

Violence against men

- More often victims of psychological than physical violence
- Difficult to identify as a victim of violence (macho culture).
- Fear of not being believed/being accused
- Average number of victims of fatal violence in a relationship: 2 persons per year (BRÅ 2017-2023)

Violence against women


- Violence is generally more severe
- More repeated
- More sexualised
- With more controlling elements
- Average number of victims of fatal violence in a relationship: 14 people per year (BRÅ 2017-2023)

















